Citizens on Patrol (COP) is a group of dedicated volunteers that work closely with Birmingham Police Department (BPD) to help prevent crime in a designated community. COP volunteers provide extra "eyes and ears" for the police by maintaining a safe environment within the community. COP volunteers notify police of suspicious activities or crimes in progress. Although they assist greatly in the crime prevention techniques of our city; COP volunteers have "NO" law enforcement authority or power.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO JOIN **CITIZENS ON PATROL?**

- 25 years of age or older
- Possess a valid Alabama Driver's License
- Successfully pass a criminal background investigation
- Mature, reliable, team player
- Able to make a minimum one-year commitment of at least four hours per week
- Successfully complete the Birmingham Citizens Police Academy Program
