Robbery Investigations Update

The Birmingham Police Department reports that detectives have charged five suspects in connection with robbery surveillance photos highlighted through the media. All the suspects were identified and arrest were made related to all three cases. All the victim's vehicles were recovered. The robberies occurred between Saturday June 9th and Monday June 11th. The robberies appear to be connected at this time. The suspects were targeting females that were getting in and out of their cars at convenience stores.

The first suspect has been identified as:

Korday Slaton, B/M, 18 Years old of Birmingham, Alabama. Three warrants for **Robbery First Degree** have been obtained against the suspect.

The second suspect has been identified as:

Jerry Carter, B/M, 18 Years old of Birmingham, Alabama. A warrant for **Robbery First Degree** has been obtained against the suspect.

The third suspect has been identified as:

Deshawn Cade, B/M, 17 Years old (charged as adult), of Birmingham, Alabama. Two warrants for **Robbery First Degree** have been obtained against the suspect.

The fourth suspect has been identified as a juvenile:

B/M, 14 Years old of Birmingham, Alabama. Two warrants for **Robbery First Degree** have been obtained against the suspect.

The fifth suspect has been identified as a juvenile:

B/M, 15 Years old of Birmingham, Alabama. A warrant for **Robbery First Degree** has been obtained against the suspect.

Further investigation found that one suspect was shown on two different photos. Additionally, another subject that was identified in the photos will not be charged.

The adult suspects were placed in the custody of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department. The juvenile suspects were placed in the custody of Family Court.
