The Birmingham Police Department reports the Jefferson County Coroner's Office has identified the victim of a homicide that occurred on Tuesday, April 6, 2021.

The victim has been identified as:
Franardo Armondo Moore, (36), B/M, of Hoover, Alabama.

Homicide Investigation (Media Release 89)

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a homicide investigation. The incident occurred on Tuesday, April 6, 2021.

The victim will be identified upon notification to the next of kin.

At approximately 2:00 a.m., North Precinct officers were on routine patrol when they heard multiple gunshots fired. Officers then patrolled the 2500 block of 13th Avenue North where they observed a male victim lying unresponsive on the side of the roadway

suffering from an apparent gunshot wound. Birmingham Fire and Rescue personnel arrived on the scene and pronounced the victim deceased.

Details are limited in this investigation.
