Homicide Investigation

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a homicide investigation. The incident occurred on Tuesday, August 17, 2021.

The victim has been identified as: Marcus Leroy Williams, 23, B/M, of Birmingham, Alabama.

At approximately 1:30 a.m., North Precinct officers were dispatched to 2549 7th Avenue North on report of a person shot. Officers arrived on the scene and observed the victim lying unresponsive in the roadway suffering from an apparent gunshot wound.

Birmingham Fire and Rescue personnel arrived on the scene and transported the victim to UAB Hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

The preliminary investigation suggests the victim was walking in the area fully nude. He reportedly approached a motorist who was sitting inside of their disabled vehicle awaiting assistance, the victim then opened the motorist's car door when the motorist shot him.

The motorist remained on the scene. The motorist was transported to the Birmingham Police Headquarters, where Homicide detectives questioned the motorist.
