Homicide Investigation

The Birmingham Police Department reports detectives are conducting a homicide investigation that occurred in the 2400 block of 4th Avenue South.

The victim has been identified as Tyrese Jamal Vault, (27) b/m of Birmingham, Alabama.

At approximately 1:19 a.m. Officers from the South Precinct responded to the scene on a call of a person shot. Officers arrived and discover Tyrese Vault in the passenger seat of a vehicle wounded by gunfire. The victim was pronounced deceased by Birmingham Fire and Rescue. An additional person showed up to a local area hospital with a gunshot wound to the leg. It was determined the victim was shot at the same location.

The preliminary investigation suggest the victim was sitting in the passenger seat of the parked vehicle when the suspect(s) fired several shots fatally wounding the victim. No arrest has been made in this homicide. Detectives have not established a clear motive in this investigation. The area was well populated with patrons at a night club nearby.
