Homicide Investigation

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a shooting investigation. The incident occurred on Thursday, December 19, 2022.

The victim has been identified as:

Shundra Denise McCray (43), B/F, of Birmingham, Alabama.

At 12:44 AM a shot spotter notification alerted multiple shots had been fired in the area. Upon arrival West Precinct officers observed a running vehicle at the edge of a driveway. Inside the victim was seated in the driver's seat suffering from multiple gunshot wounds.

Birmingham Fire and Rescue Service responded to the scene and pronounced the victim deceased.

Currently there are no suspects in custody.
