




**Total UOF Incidents** Year to Year Comparison



Use of Force on Body Worn Camera or Surveillance Video









### Police Shootings Year to Year Comparison








#### Number of UOF Incidents by Month




#### Number of UOF Incidents by Time of Day



### Number of UOF Incidents by Day of Week





#### **Case Classification**

Open Case: Case is still an active investigation or waiting a discipline determination

Sustained: The allegation is suported by sufficient evidence

Not Sustained: Insufficient evidence either to prove or disprove the allegation Exonerated: Incident complained of occurred but was lawful and proper

Unfounded: Allegation is false or not factual Withdrawn: Case withdrawn by complainant


Administratively Cleared: Case closed due to the subject employee retiring, resigning, or being terminated on a different case.
