Homicide Investigation

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a homicide investigation. The incident occurred on Sunday, May 21, 2023.

The victim has been identified as: Christian Breon Wyatt, (27), B/M, of Birmingham, Alabama.

At approximately 5:25 AM, South Precinct officers were dispatched to a Shots Fired call at the Courtland Vesta apartment complex, located at 2173 Highland Avenue.

As officers were en route, the call was updated to a Person Shot call.

Officers arrived on the scene and entered a parking garage when they observed the victim lying unresponsive suffering from an apparent gunshot wound.

Birmingham Fire and Rescue personnel arrived on the scene and pronounced the victim deceased.

The preliminary investigation suggests the victim was involved in a confrontation in the parking garage and an unknown suspect(s) fired shots at him. The victim was struck by gunfire.

There is no one in custody.

This is Birmingham's 45th murder investigation of 2023 with 3 justifiable death investigations). The Birmingham Police Department adheres to FBI Uniform Crime Reporting guidelines set for all law enforcement agencies across the United States. FBI Uniform Crime Reporting guidelines do not require law enforcement agencies to include justifiable death investigations in the total homicide investigations counts.

The information is based on a preliminary and ongoing investigation, which continues to evolve as investigators interview witnesses, review physical and electronic records, and analyze forensic evidence. The Department's understanding of the facts and circumstances may change as additional evidence is collected and analyzed
