Homicide Investigation

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a homicide investigation. The incident occurred on Tuesday, May 2, 2023.

The victim has been identified as: Monica Lynn Nichols, 59, B/F, of Birmingham, Alabama.

At approximately 1:00 PM, South Precinct officers were dispatched to Glenbrook at Oxmoor Valley Apartment Complex (2801 Sydney Boulevard) on report of a family who had not heard from their loved one.

Officers arrived on the scene and conducted a welfare check at Building 2821. Officers entered an apartment and discovered the victim lying unresponsive. Birmingham Fire and Rescue personnel arrived on the scene and pronounced the victim deceased.

Officers were unable to rule out foul play.

The Jefferson County Coroner's Office responded to the location; Jefferson County Coroner's Office personnel discovered the victim suffered a gunshot wound.

There is no one in custody.

This is Birmingham's 37th murder investigation of 2023 with 3 justifiable death investigations). The Department's understanding of the facts and circumstances may change as additional evidence is collected and analyzed
