## **Homicide Investigation**

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a homicide investigation. The incident occurred on Sunday, June 11, 2023

The victim has been identified as:

**Montraevius DeWayne Milton, (18), B/M, of Pinson, Alabama.**

At approximately 2:05 AM, East Precinct officers were dispatched to the 4100 Block of 49<sup>th</sup> Terrace North on report of Multiple Shots Fired calls. The call was updated to a Person Shot call.

Officers arrived on the scene and observed the victim lying unresponsive in the roadway suffering from an apparent gunshot wound.

Birmingham Fire and Recue and personnel arrived on scene and then pronounced the victim deceased.

The preliminary investigation suggests a party was being held at a residence. An argument took place outside the residence and shots were fired. Officers recovered over 100 spent shell casings.

There is no one in custody.
