Arrest Made in the Nakita Walker Homicide Investigation

The Birmingham Police Department reports detectives have obtained a warrant for an arrest in connection to the murder of Nakita Walker. She was shot and killed on **Thursday, June 20, 2024**.

The suspect has been identified as: Demetrious Kidd, (41), B/M, of Birmingham, Alabama.

Birmingham Police Detectives presented case information to the Jefferson County District Attorney's Office. After an assessment of the information, detectives obtained a warrant for **Capital Murder (Robbery)**.

On Friday, June 28, 2024, Demetrious Kidd turned himself in to police custody.

Demetrious Kidd is in the custody of the Jefferson County Jail where he is being held with **No Bond**.

Homicide Investigation (Media Release 144)

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a homicide investigation. The incident occurred on **Thursday June 20, 2024**.

The victim has been identified as: Nakita Nicole Walker, (26) B/F, of Hoover, Alabama.

At around 10:15 p.m., West Precinct officers were dispatched to a Person Shot call at a residence in the 700 Block of New Hill Court.

Officers arrived on the scene and then discovered the victim lying unresponsive on an exterior staircase.

Birmingham Fire and Rescue personnel arrived and pronounced the victim deceased.

The preliminary investigation suggests an adult male (suspect) was at the location causing a disturbance. The suspect began arguing with the victim. During the argument, the suspect shot the victim.

The suspect is not in custody.
