Homicide Investigation

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a homicide investigation. The incident occurred on **Wednesday**, **July 3**, **2024**.

The victim has been identified as:

Dianisleidy Rodriguez Hernandez, (34), H/F, of Cuba.

At around 4:40 p.m., South Precinct officers were dispatched to a Person Shot call at an apartment complex in the 4200 Block of 5th Avenue South.

Officers arrived on the scene when they observed the victim near an apartment suffering from a gunshot wound.

Birmingham Fire and Rescue personnel arrived and pronounced the victim deceased.

The preliminary investigation suggests a resident of the apartment complex shot the victim and remained in the area. Patrol officers took the suspect into custody near the incident location. The suspect and victim appear to know one another.

The suspect has been identified as:

Johnny Sears Jr. (44), B/M, of Birmingham, Alabama.

Birmingham Police Detectives presented case information to the Jefferson County District Attorney's Office. After an assessment of the information, detectives obtained a warrant for **Murder** on Johnny Sears Jr.

Johnny Sears Jr. is in the custody of the Jefferson County Jail where he is being held

with No Bond.
