Triple Homicide Investigation

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a triple homicide investigation. The incident occurred on **Saturday**, **July**, **13**, **2024**.

The victims have been identified as:

- 1. Landon Brooks, (5), B/M, of Center Point, Alabama.
- 2. Arkia Berry, (28), B/F, of Center Point, Alabama.
- 3. Eric Ashley Jr, (28), B/M, of Hoover, Alabama.

At around 5:20 p.m., East Precinct officers were dispatched to a car accident call in the 1700 Block of Indian Summer Drive.

Officers arrived on the scene when they observed a wrecked vehicle in the front yard of a residence. Officers observed the vehicle had been shot into. Upon further investigation of the vehicle, officers observed three gunshot victims inside the vehicle.

Birmingham Fire and Rescue personnel arrived and pronounced all three victims deceased.

The preliminary investigation suggests the victims were inside their vehicle in the 1700 Block of Indian Summer Drive (near the entrance to Echo Highlands Park) when they were shot in a targeted shooting.

There is no one in custody.

Federal law enforcement personnel responded to the scene and are assisting BPD in this investigation.

The Department's understanding of the facts and circumstances may change as additional evidence is collected and analyzed
