Arrest Made in the Carlos Seawright Homicide Investigation

The Birmingham Police Department reports detectives have obtained a warrant for an arrest in connection to the murder of Carlos Seawright. He was shot and killed on **Tuesday, May 7, 2024**, in the 6800 Block of 1st Avenue South.

The suspect has been identified as: Na'Derious Jackson, (24), B/M, of Center Point, Alabama.

During this investigation, the community assisted BPD Homicide detectives.

In July, Birmingham Police Detectives presented case information to the Jefferson County District Attorney's Office. After an assessment of the information, detectives obtained a warrant for **Murder**.

On Monday, August 12, 2024, BPD's Crime Reduction Team arrested Jackson.

Na'Derious Jackson is in the custody of the Jefferson County Jail where he is being held with **No Bond**.

Homicide Investigation (Media Release 92)

The Birmingham Police Department is conducting a homicide investigation. The incident occurred on **Tuesday**, **May 7**, **2024**.

The victim has been identified as: Carlos Seawright, (33), B/M, of Birmingham, Alabama.

At approximately 3:20 p.m., East Precinct officers were dispatched to a Person Shot call at a residence in the 6800 Block of 1st Avenue South.

Officers arrived on the scene and then observed the victim lying unresponsive in the front yard of the residence.

Birmingham Fire and Rescue personnel arrived on the scene and pronounced the victim deceased.

The preliminary investigation suggests a passing motorists observed the victim and dialed 911. Additional details are limited in this investigation.

There is no one in custody.

The information is based on a preliminary and ongoing investigation, which continues to evolve as investigators interview witnesses, review physical and electronic records, and analyze forensic evidence. The Department's understanding of the facts and circumstances may change as additional evidence is collected and analyzed
